Three completely free ways you can help the school!

1. Send in your second-hand books

Do you have unwanted books at home? The school would love it if we could bring in good quality books that are no longer read at home. Books will be quarantined for a few days, and then distributed between the appropriate year groups. It would be great to build up the selection of books at school and I'm sure we all have a few nice books spare.

2. Donate unwanted musical instruments

Do you have an outgrown violin at home? An unwanted tuba lying around? Please contact the school office if you are able to donate musical instruments. Obviously they would need to assess whether they were actually suitable for the children to learn on. But I'm sure we would all like to see as much musical opportunity at the Belham as possible.

EasyFundraising

This will generate donations for FoB at many online retailers. Create an account in support of FoB here: https://bit.ly/FoB_EasyFundraising

Start your shopping via the EasyFundraising site, use their 'donation reminder' widget in your browser, or use their mobile app. It will take you to retailer sites and apply the donation automatically. Loads of retailers are signed up, with varying levels of donation: John Lewis, Waterstones, Ethical Superstore, Majestic Wine, M&S, Argos, and Boden to name a few...

AmazonSmile

Friends of Belham is now also registered with AmazonSmile. 0.5% of the purchase price will go direct to FoB.

On a computer you must shop via smile.amazon.co.uk for this to work.

You can shop on the standard Amazon mobile apps but must set Friends of Belham as the beneficiary for AmazonSmile in the app settings.
